The World Service Conference workshop in Arlington, Virginia, is less than a month away--July 13th, 14th, and 15th. We're trying out a new format for the weekend, designed especially to encourage participation. We welcome the attendance of all interested N.A. members. Enclosed, you'll find an agenda to help you plan your weekend.

The workshop will be held at the Key Bridge Marriott Hotel, 1401 Lee Highway, Arlington, VA 22209. The telephone number is (703) 524-6400. Room rates are \$78.00 per night for single/double, *plus* 9.5% tax, for a total of \$85.41 per night. The hotel is 10 minutes from Washington National Airport, and 25 minutes from Dulles Airport. No shuttle service is provided by the hotel.

Unlike previous conference workshops, the Arlington weekend will combine meetings of the world service boards and committees with various open forums, learning sessions, panel presentations and discussions. Many of the weekend's events will be running at the same time. You can use the agenda to pick the sessions you're most interested in.

The panel presentations and discussions being held Saturday and Sunday afternoon are entirely new to the workshop agenda. We've chosen four critical topics related to the growth of Narcotics Anonymous--N.A.'s image, literature priorities, world service finances, and worldwide development--and have asked panel members to prepare short presentations to lead off the discussions. We hope the panel presentations and discussions will be lively, enlightening experiences for all of us as we consider how to better serve N.A. in the coming decade.

One item usually on the conference workshop agenda will be absent in Arlington. No combined general forum has been scheduled for the weekend. Instead, a variety of open forums have been scheduled by the various service boards and committees throughout the weekend. Questions you may have about a specific field of service can be addressed at the forum conducted by the board or committee responsible for that field.
