If you need copies of anything ask whoever is on the copying machine to make them for you. Jim suggested that five or six people volunteer for copying but Roger said that would not be necessary. Whoever has charge of the machine should have someone to replace them when they are ready to take a break. Whoever runs the copy machine should be someone who was in the library when the Xerox man was demonstrating the machine.

Tom made the motion that the conference pay for any expenses incurred by either one of the phones. The motion was seconded. Some discussion followed. The motion was passed unanimously.

A motion was made that the telephone in the meeting room be unplugged during group discussions in meetings. The motion was seconded and passed. Roger suggested that someone be posted downstairs to answer the phone in the kitchen.

Roger said that it was his feeling that our only function is to carry the message in World Service Conference, written form to the still suffering addict. He also stated that if you are interested in gossip make it clear that it is your opinion and not that of the conference.

Greg pointed out that our directive from the World Service Conference is to compile and edit what was written by individuals.

Jim suggested that we pass out forms for anyone interested in becoming members of the World Literature Committee. Roger said that if the people are present and leave an address they are automatically members of the committee unless the committee is otherwise notified. Greg read Item 4, page 38 of the Service manual which are the guidelines and purposes of the World Literature Committee.

Roger said that the first five chapters of the book were lost. They had been through second edit and an original typed. The original was lost. The other five have been through input and partial second edit. Our first priority is to get the first five chapters reinput and the second five typed up in the form they were in.

Our second priority is to update the mailing list. A large mailing list is being put together and put over. If you have an address book, we would like to have the address service. It would also be good to have first names and last names of people who are on the list.

Roger said that this mailing list would be used strictly in the fellowship. The World Service Office will receive a copy so they can compile the World Directory. The Literature Committee wants to get a hold of as many people in as many different areas as possible. If you don't want your name and number on the list don't give it to us.

Different groups in different areas have been working on chapters 4, 6, 8, 9, and 10 after the Santa Monica Conference. The World Literature Conference would like to know the status of those chapters.

Chapter 4 was sent to California and the report was that they completed the Introduction, and the first and second steps.

Chapter 6 was sent to Southern California and they reported that they got the first three steps done. Chapter 8 was sent to British Columbia and is now in progress.

Chapter 9 was sent to St. Louis and they reported that they got two pages done. They are doing a thorough rewriting of the chapter.

Chapter 10 was sent to Lincoln and they reported that some work has been done all the way through the chapter and that they now have a rough draft copy of the chapter.

Greg made the motion that we proceed with the typing of all of the material and that all of the work that has been done be typed in the form that they are now in. Charles amended the motion by suggesting that we set up workshops to finish the work that has been started. Roger stated that we should get the five chapters typed up and that the people who worked on them should be available to answer questions.

It was decided that we should have a workshop for editing and proofreading to correct spelling or grammar.

Roger said we should take what we have, type it up and see what needs to be done. A vote was taken on Greg's motion and carried.

It was brought up that we need to work on pamphlets. The pamphlets that we need are: "The World Literature Conference", "The World Literature Conference", and "The World Literature Conference".

RECOMMENDED PROCEDURES FOR LITERATURE WORKSHOPS

PROCEDURES

1. What is the title of the material to be covered?
2. List things that group thinks will pertain to the title.
3. Look at previous outlines for things you missed.
4. Out of the list decide what are major topics and what go under major topics from list.
5. Type up that topic outline and make copies.
6. Get all source material that might be useful to the material as defined by the topic outline. Make two or more copies of each source.
7. Set one copy aside for original source copy.
8. Mark the second copy as it pertains to the topic outline by topic and item number. Sentences, paragraphs or pages can be marked. "X" out material which doesn't pertain.
9. Cut marked material and separate into piles by topic and item number.
10. Consider each pile in order and arrange in sequence by pasting up on a piece of paper. Sequence should be designed to include useful information and leave out non-pertinent material at that point.
11. When all material is pasted up, a typist participating in the group should type it up quickly. The typist should be free to add or change material as they go so that the work will proceed more quickly and yet still be subject to group conscienceness after typing.
12. Note: While the group discussion of the topic outline is important, the procedure of clipping and pasting is mechanical and too much discussion at this point will goof up the process because no lasting change can be effected.
13. The typed material goes immediately back to the group for evaluation in terms of topic outline, clip and paste material and source material. Make any improvement possible and retype.
14. This constitutes a complete workshop draft.

1. First round of discussion - 15 minutes.
2. Mandatory group conscience sessions - two per day, one in the morning and one in the afternoon or evening. Impromptu sessions (limited to 15 minutes) when emergency situations arise.
3. Limit discussion to 15 minutes per topic, one comment per person, per motion - limited to three minutes.
4. Explain and restate each motion before it is called to vote.
5. Each participant should be identified by name and area from. Each member introduced by name, place of residence and state. A written report from each area should be given to the secretary for inclusion in the minutes.
6. All motions should be introduced by name.
7. No National or Anonymous motions should be introduced at the conference.
